## RELIEF ACTIVIES

At Village/Flood Relief Camps and Households Level

During the month of August 2020, heavy rainfall resulted in major flooding and a province-wide Monsoon Flood Emergency was declared by the Government of Sindh in 23 districts in the province. Essential infrastructure including roads, bridges, and homes was severely damaged and according to SRSO's Initial Rapid Assessment, 223 deaths have been reported with 323 injured so far.

Considering the overall effects of disaster on vulnerable communities, SRSO initiated the relief operation with rescue and relief interventions to respond to the immediate needs.

On a priority basis, SRSO initiated the operation in terms of distribution of Ration bags to fulfill urgent lifesaving needs of households in relative severely affected areas, targeted unconditional food assistance to the most affected and vulnerable households for a limited period, to enable the households to cope with the immediate effects of the disaster.

According to the data collected during IRA by SRSO, 90% of households in affected areas do not have enough resources to purchase food from markets. The situation is worse in rural areas (90%) in comparison to urban areas. Among districts, families in affected areas s have very limited access to food.

Urgent emergency assistance in such districts where the percentage of complete villages are under water and damaged their Katcha houses and came to the road for relief by keeping their need, SRSO extended their support in terms of distribution of ration bags and cooked food to the affected community.

Targeted unconditional food assistance and provided stitched ladies and their babies' clothes to the most affected and vulnerable households.

livestock protection and management interventions have been intervened through free animal treatment and vaccination camps, so up to now, 23921 livestock has been vaccinated to protect the core assets of the affected communities.

immediately provide safe drinking water to the affected population through water tanks, or distribution of water purification tablets or sachets, etc.
