

SRSO successfully completed the Summer Special Classes in four SEF-GoS supported Community-Cluster Schools in Shikarpur and Kashmore@Kandhkot districts. These classes were started with an aim to improve the academic performance of rural students under the guidance of SRSO-Chairperson Ms. Naheed Shah Durrani and CEO-SRSO Mr. Muhammad Dittal Kalhoro.

Pakistan Parenting Care Flood 2022 Campaign with University of Oxford

Construction of Resilient Low-Cost Houses for flood victims with financial support of SANA

Kamber-Shahdadkot/June26, 2023

Sindh Rural Support Organization (SRSO) is taking initiative to reconstruct resilient Low-Cost Housing (LCH) for the flood victims in the Kamber-Shahdadkot district. The project is being funded by the Sindhi Association of North America (SANA) with an aim to construct resilient shelter to the most vulnerable families affected by the floods 2022.

During July-August 2023, SRSO plans to construct 52 LCHs (one room with a varanda) in village Khoro Brohi UC & Taluka Warrah. The construction process will involve active participation from the SRSO-fostered Village Organization (VO). The houses have been specifically handed over to women beneficiaries.

A dialogue was conducted with beneficiaries at village Khoro Brohi by Mr. Asad Ali Jatoi (Regional Manager-SRSO Larkana Region), along with the SRSO-Physical Infrastructure and Technology Development (PITD) team. The purpose of dialogue was to discuss the Terms of Partnership (ToP), which includes defining the roles and responsibilities of the

partners/stakeholders, as well as outlining the procedures and quidelines for the construction.



3 Women & Girls Friendly Spaces established under Gender-Based Violence In Emergency Project

Kashmore@Kandhkot, Shikarpur and Sukkur/April-June, 2023



The Gender-Based Violence In Emergency (GBVie) Project is being implemented by SRSO in partnership with RSPN supported by UNFPA with an aim to mitigate gender-based violence in flood-affected areas by providing support to women and girls in the targeted 3 districts of Sindhi.e. Sukkur, Shikarpur and Kashmore@Kandhkot.

Under the project, 3 Women and Girls Friendly Spaces (WGFS) have been established in UC Akheri, Mogiyani and Roshanabad of each district to provide safe and learning venue for providing awareness raising, hygienic care, medical and socio-pyschio support to flood-affected area. Under the project 1,500 (500 in each district) female dignity kits were also distributed, above 15,000 women, girls and community members were aware on GBV, legal rights, health, hygiene, family planning and developed referral path ways with key line departments and service providers in each district.

1,075 dignity kits and 600 mosquito's nets were distributed and organized under HOPE Project

Shikarpur and Kamber-Shahdadkot /June30, 2023

SRSO in collaboration with RSPN under Red Crescent funded HOPE Project undertook different flood relief activities in affected areas in Shikarpur and Kamber-Shahdadkot districts. It aimed to provide primary health, family planning and hygiene care services to most flood-affected communities especially women and girls. At the end of June, 2023, total 1,075 dignity kits and 600 mosquito's nets were distributed and organized 40 free medical camps to provide family planning and OPD services to women, young girls and children.

Community awareness sessions on quality health care and hygiene were also organized during camps in targeted communities.
