

## 12th Sartyoon Sang Crafts Exhibition Organized by CED-SRSO

Ocean Mall Karachi/February 3-5, 2023

The 12th Sartyoon Sang Crafts Exhibition was organized by CED-SRSO in collaboration with the Government of Sindh and other partners. The main objective of the exhibition was to provide better income opportunities for the flood-affected women artisans of rural Sindh. The three-day event was held at Ocean Mall, Karachi, and inaugurated by Mohtarma Aseefa Bhutto Zardari, who visited each stall, met with rural artisans, and appreciated their crafts. On the occasion, Sindh Minister for Health, Dr. Azra Peechuho, Minister for Local Government, Syed Nasir Hussain Shah, Provincial Secretary, Minority Affairs Muhammad Abbas Baloch, CEO-SRSO, Mr. Muhammad Dittal Kalhoro, BoD-SRSO Mr. Azar Ayaz, and Mr. Ghulam Sarwar Khehro were also present.

The exhibition showcased handmade crafts including clothing, accessories, and home decor items made by 1,572 artisans from

12 districts of Sindh. The event received an overwhelming response from visitors and was widely covered by mainstream media in Sindhi, Urdu, and English languages. 
