

NADRA Mobile Registration camps under Women's Socio-Economic Resilience Project

Sukkur, Khairpur and Dadu/September July-September 2023

Sindh Rural Support Organization (SRSO) is implementing the Women's Socio-Economic Resilience in Pakistan (WSERP) Project in partnership with Rural Support Programmes Network (RSPN) Pakistan and UN Women Pakistan & People of Japan. The main objective of the Project is to improve women's access to essential services in flood-affected areas of Sukkur, Khairpur, and Dadu districts of Sindh.

At present, SRSO is campaigning for CNIC registration through mobile camps in collaboration with NADRA in all 3 targeted districts. For this purpose, 34 NADRA Mobile Registration Camps were organized at Dadu 12, Sukkur16 & Khairpur6 and registered 1,999 (Dadu 570, Sukkur929 & Khairpur500) smart cards, new and renewed CNICs and B-forms of the community members. Community volunteers played an active role in organizing, managing, facilitating, and mobilizing the community members and registration camp.

SRSO Thatta office supported to District Administration and DDMA Thatta in organizing Mock Drill on flood emergency response through early warning system, safe evacuation and relief camp management. This drill was organized at Village Organization Allah Dino Manchhari, UC Bijora. UNDP delegation led by Mr. Andrew also participated and observed the Mock drill from start to end.

After drill, a meeting was held at DC Office Thatta and disused the role of DDMA and District Administration and appreciated to SRSO in the facilitating and managing the Mock drill in an effective manner.

Flood Emergency Response under Equine Welfare Project with Brooke Pakistan

Khairpur, Sukkur, Shikarpur, Jacobabad, Larkana and Kamber-Shahdadkot/September, 2022

SRSO in partnership with the Brooke Pakistan is improving equine animals through strengthened systems for equine welfare and thriving equine owning communities. The heavy rainfall 2022 has affected all houses and agricultural land, equine animals, and Livestock being heavily damaged. Looking this situation, SRSO initiated operation to provide ease to equine-owning communities affected by the flood. People and animals in dire need were given rations for humans and animals, and mosquito nets and fly repellents were distributed by SRSO. Free Veterinary Medical Camps were also facilitated to equine owning communities and others. Routine awareness of equine-owning communities was also part of our intervention.

The 1st and 2nd phase of emergency relief support was provided to equine communities in covering 6 districts 4,518 feed/fodder distribution, 30 construction of shed/shelter and manger, 30 construction of manger (Feed Trough), 113 provision of portable water trough, 74 provision of first aid box, 41 installation of

hand pumps, 44 community change agents (CCAs) trained on preventive care and management, 80 awareness sessions on husbandry practices, 669 first aid and emergency treatment for equine animals and 1906 breaching straps distribution.

A Way to Self-Reliance-Brief Success Stories

Meet Samira, a Community Resource Person (CRP) working in village Jan Mohammad Lighari, distric Kamber-Shahdakot, Sindh



Samira w/o Sabir Hussain, is a mother of five children, with three boys and two girls. Four of her school-going-aged children attend school as well. She is the 2nd group of women Community Resource Persons (CRPs) from the village Jan Muhammad UC Misri Khan, district Kamber-Shahdadkot, Sindh who were selected and engaged in 2022 for selling and marketing nutrition and hygiene products and services to rural women under the BEP (Balanced Energy Protein) Project funded by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and implemented by Sindh Rural Support Organization (SRSO) in partnership with RSPN and Hystra Paris. She visits 20 to 25 households daily in their assigned area to sell products to women to improve their health, nutrition, and hygiene. Now, Samira's monthly income is between 10,000 to 11,000 thousand, which she primarily uses for her children's education and health.

Samira works in the field for the well-being of women as part of the BEP Project, which has given her a mobile phone and training on data punching. This has allowed her to punch her sales data herself on an app and generate income. Samira's work is a source of inspiration for women in rural areas, showing them that they too can run a business from their homes. "It was challenging for me and my family to decide to work on the project, but after they made the decision, I feel

proud to contribute to the family livelihood support and well-being of women of the own area," Samiara says with confidence.

Samira's story highlights the impact of empowering women with skills and technology in rural areas. By providing access and knowledge, women like her can become self-sufficient and contribute to their family's well-being. It is crucial to continue supporting programs like the BEP project to help more women like Samira achieve economic independence.

A diminutive life story of Masmat Saleemat after receiving an asset from IFAD-NPGP through the SRSO in district Shikarpur, Sindh

Ms. Saleemat, a beneficiary of the NPGP program and resident of Waryam Shar village district Shikarpur, is a mother of seven children who has been struggling to meet the basic needs of her family. She expressed her difficulties, saying, "I didn't have any resources for living life, therefore I could not care for myself and other family members." Additionally, she revealed that she is suffering from a fatal disease, hepatitis B, and their home was severely damaged during the monsoon rains, resulting in the death of their cattle. As a result, her entire family was left homeless and without any support, leading them to feel hopeless.

However, the situation took a positive turn when the IFAD program arrived in their village, bringing a great blessing from God. Ms. Saleemat's name was identified and selected to receive a productive asset to support her livelihood and enable her to graduate from poverty on a sustainable basis.

"With the assistance of the program, my son now drives the asset, a Fatta rakhsawa, and earns Rs. 500 to 700 daily, which



is enough to sustain their livelihood. We also started saving money, moving closer to a successful life." Ms. Saleemat spoke with confidence and a smile and expressed her gratitude for the opportunities provided by the NPGP-IFAD-MOPASS and SRSOs.
